The highlight of my Patrolling years was the 1982 Alpine Meadows avalanche. I was just certified in Avalanche Rescue the day before.....and was now involved in a 5-7 day Rescue/Recovery Operations, for 7 missing persons. During my Patroller years, I gained a passion to provide better Medical Aid to my patients. I soon took an EMT course and loved it! This soon became a pivotal point in my career choice, from an Engineering path...now towards a Medical/Fire Service path. After obtaining my EMT certificate, I was hired to work in the Emergency Department of Saint Agnes Medical Center, in Fresno, CA. A very progressive Hospital of its time with a Heli-pad & Helicopter, a CT Scanner and a Cath Lab....all cutting edge technology then. I later worked for Clovis Ambulance, working the Metro-Rural areas in the Valley and I was also contracted to provide Medical coverage for the PG&E Helms Hydroelectric Project, in the eastern Sierras. All our patients were Medi-vac via Helicopter, due to the remote locations of the project. A great experience!

I later attended Stanford Medical Center Hospital's Mobile Intensive Care Paramedic program. After graduating, I worked for Santa Clara Valley paramedics-SCV Paramedics, stationed in downtown San Jose, Ca.

After working a couple years in the “combat” zone.... I moved to Sonoma County, worked for a few local Private Ambulance Companies and flew as a Tactical Flight Paramedic for the Sonoma County Sheriff's Helicopter Unit. All the while, I was in search of a more sustainable career, as a Firefighter/Paramedic. I soon was hired by the Marin County Fire Department and enjoyed a 28-year career with them. During my Fire Service career with MCFD, I became a Fire Service Instructor and was 1 of 3 EMT Instructors providing on-going continuous education for all our Firefighters and adjoining agencies. I also proudly served on the newly formed Marin County Urban Search and Rescue Team-USAR, both as a Medical Specialist and a Collapsed Structure Specialist.

As most know, many Firefighters usually have a “side job”. Mine became teaching EMT. In 1996 I became the EMT Program coordinator for the College of Marin. I developed and ran this program for 10 years, before signing-on to teach for the Santa Rosa Junior College programs here in Windsor, at the Public Safety Training Center. Also in 1996, I became a founding member and Fire Captain with the Lake Pillsbury Fire Protection District. I retired from the Marin County Fire Department in 2015, yet I continue to teach EMT at SRJC part-time and serve as the Fire Chief for the Lake Pillsbury Fire Protection District.

My wife Carol and I have been married for almost 35 years now. Before having kids, Carol was an Operations Manager for the UCSF Medical Center department(s) of Surgery. After our two daughters began school, Carol decided to stay home to raise our girls.
