I am going to talk about the Jimmy's Lakeside Café change and how it affects us. It's quite a change and change is sometimes difficult to adapt to, especially when it hits us in the pocketbook. I've met with the new owner Jimmy a few times and watched as he remodeled the restaurant and freshened up our meeting room. He's been in the restaurant business a long time and came out of retirement to create something that will last, not only for himself, but for his family too. As such, he must create a pleasant atmosphere, have very good food, exceptional service along with pricing that is competitive and yet sufficient to support the restaurant and its employees. Jim is very adamant that his employees are happy, and do relatively well, hence his insistence on a 20% tip from all groups, not just from SIRs. Our

past practice of throwing a few dollars on a table after the buffet was over was something he was against....because his employees would not sufficiently benefit. That 20% is why our luncheons now cost \$30.00 and why the cost of the holiday party increased.

I've also heard some complaints that the pricing for us is higher than the menu pricing. Of course it is; Groups are handled differently than just a few folks because it takes more employees to serve a group, along with other employees to set up and clean the meeting room. It's apples and oranges. Simply stated, it's the extra cost for the privledge of about 50 guys having lunch together. No doubt we had it really good with Charlies, but that's no reason to be frustrated with the new place. I must admit that Jim and I had some heated words about price changes and what I perceived was us being devalued. After listening intently to him, I don't think that's true. I believe him when he says he wants to serve us and make us happy. Now, Steve may decide to form a committee to look into other options, but my guess is that there will be problems/drawbacks regardless where we look. We are simply in different times where things now cost more. We were paying \$23.00 and throwing in a couple of bucks for the tip...so now we pay \$5.00 a month more (which goes to the servers). Most of us are fortunate enough to easily handle that. As to food quality, we'll keep an eye on that.

I guess most of all, I am hoping that these increases do not deter anyone from coming to our meetings. Being a strong, caring, and fun branch needs to remain our top priority. In order to keep doing that, we absolutely need to have good luncheon turnouts. So please don't get distracted by changes and problems we didn't create. We have excellent proven leaders for the next two years, so let's all support them and this branch. I sincerely hope I see you November 19th at my final luncheon as your Big Sir.

Bocce Ball at the Senior's Center Thursdays at 10:00am. All are welcome.






